OBJECTIVE	To establish guidelines for coaching at the baths.

THAT subject to comment from the Swimming Club concerned:

1. No professional coaching rights be approved;
2. The appropriate ruling Amateur Swimming Club be asked to control all amateur coaching at the Pool and be given authority to appoint all amateur coaches and to allocate all pupils;
3. It be a pre-requisite that both the amateur coaches and the pupil be members of Amateur Swimming Club;
4. The Amateur Coaches be nominated in writing by the Club to the Council and these persons be allowed free admission to the Pool for coaching purposes;
5. Additional applications will be considered by Council on request.

ADDENDUM (14th June, 1988)

THAT no change be made to the existing policy and that the following definitions be included as policy:

1. Professional Coaching

Coaching of competent swimmers by an Accredited professional Coach for Regional, State or Commonwealth Swimming Championships necessitating the use of Swimming Lane set aside for this purpose between certain specified times.

2. Improvement Swimming Coaching

By a qualified Swimming Coach for non-proficient swimmers, whether Adult or Children, in order to improve their water confidence and swimming ability.

REVIEW OF GUIDELINES 11 MAY 1993

1. No professional coaching rights be approved, with the definition of a professional coach being:
“Coaching of competent swimmers by an Accredited Professional Coach for Region, State or Commonwealth Swimming Championships necessitating the use of Swimming Lanes set aside for this purpose between certain specified times.”
2. The appropriate ruling Amateur Swimming Club be asked to control all amateur coaching at the Pool and be given authority to appoint all amateur coaches and to allocate all pupils;
3. It be a pre-requisite that both the amateur coaches and the pupil be members of Amateur Swimming Clubs;
4. The Amateur Coaches be nominated, in writing, by the Club to the Council and these persons be allowed free admission to the Pool for coaching purposes;
5. Additional applications will be considered by Council on request.
