# Work on the new Melville Ford Bridge is underway

Construction has started on the new and improved Melville Ford Bridge. Thanks to the hard work of Council staff, an enhanced design has been locked in, elevating the new bridge 6.7m higher than the existing bridge with a separated pedestrian walkway. # New amenities for Cooks Square Park

We're delivering a new and improved amenities building at Cooks Square Park, East Maitland. More modern, accessible and gender inclusive, the new facilities will better serve local clubs like Maitland FC. Construction is now underway, with the new building set to open early next year.





# Skate parks: Largs and Gillieston Heights

We've recently taken the wraps off the new Largs Skate Park, funded by the Australian Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure program. Now open to the public, the park features a pump track, half pipe, seating, drinking fountains and shelters. Work is also underway on the new Gillieston Heights Skate Park and playspace at Roy Jordan Oval. Funded by Council and the NSW Government, work is due to be finished by the end of the year. # Tocal Road upgrades

We've completed a \$1.9 million upgrade to Tocal Road, Bolwarra Heights. Funded by the NSW Government, work included widening and reconstructing the road to improve traffic flow. Further resurfacing work will take place in the coming months to benefit the road in the long term. Meanwhile, work on nearby Lang Drive was also recently completed as was Anambah Road, Anambah.




# Maitland New Year's Eve celebrations presented by Valley Estate Agents
