Unit Description

Students explore the importance of water in present and past local communities, by examining the various ways water is used and developing an understanding of why access to clean water is so important.

Key Inquiry Questions

- -What happened to local water supplies and why did the Hunter Valley need a water treatment facility?

Assessment Activities

Short response- Describe one way a Hunter Valley resident could get water before tap water was introduced into homes. (see worksheets)
